## **BACKGROUND**

The National Education Policy (NEP) 2020 advocates for the recognition of foundational literacy, education access, and livelihood pursuit as fundamental rights for all citizens,



emphasizing the transformative potential of literacy and basic education in fostering personal, civic, economic, and lifelong-learning opportunities.

NEP 2020 recommends innovative measures for Adult Education, proposing a curriculum framework tailored to the diverse needs of adult learners, with an emphasis on local employment, differentiated teaching methods, and materials designed to meet adult learning requirements.

The true progress of our nation can only be achieved when every citizen attains a basic level of literacy including financial literacy, digital literacy and life skills, enabling them to actively contribute to their personal growth and the development of the nation. The Government of India is implementing a centrally sponsored scheme called *Nav Bharat Saaksharta Karyakram* popularly known as ULLAS: Understanding of Lifelong Learning for All in Society and Tagline/Slogan of the ULLAS is “*Jan Jan Saakshar*”

ULLAS - *Nav Bharat Saaksharta Karyakram*, aims to provide foundational literacy and numeracy to people aged 15 and above from all backgrounds who missed formal schooling, helping them integrate into society and contribute to the nation's growth. The scheme being implemented during 2022-23 to 2026-27 has five components namely (i) Foundational Literacy and Numeracy, (ii) Critical Life Skills, (iii) Basic Education, (iv) Vocational Skills, (v) Continuing Education.

ULLAS envisages to impart basic skills to navigate the digital landscape, like banking, payment, accessing useful sites, apps, etc. The scheme's impact is being assessed through the certification of Foundational Literacy and Numeracy skills of registered non-literates/learners.



The scheme motivates volunteers to take part in the scheme as *DUTY* or *Kartavyabodh* towards the nation building and incentivises the student volunteers through credits in school/ university/ TEIs and appreciation through other means like certificates, appreciation letters, felicitation, etc. This scheme marks a paradigm shift in community empowerment and lifelong learning by promoting a sense of ownership, collaboration, and shared responsibility for societal progress. The significant participation of the community serves as a foundation for the scheme's effectiveness and sustainable impact. A good number of non-literate learners from twenty-seven States/UTs participated in the Foundational Literacy and Numeracy Assessment Tests.

To understand the progress and challenges pertaining to the implementation of ULLAS and learn from the learners and volunteer teachers about the methods and means of teaching including LTM, regional conferences in the country are being conducted comprising 8-10 States/UTs in each region.

**Main objectives of these sessions were:**

- To understand the needs of learners, neo-literates, VTs and State, District, Block and Gram Panchayat level stakeholders for strengthening of ULLAS in the country.
- Development of Teaching and Learning Materials of ULLAS in regional/local languages for stakeholders.
- Incorporation of inputs and best practices in the implementation strategy for strengthening of ULLAS.

Interactive sessions and panel discussions with the non-literate learners, neo-literates, volunteer teachers, community members and officials of each participating State/UT were the highlight of the regional conferences.

**Four ULLAS regional conferences in collaboration with SCERT Haryana, SLMA Bhopal, SLMA Assam and SLMA Telangana were organized during the financial year 2024-2025.** A total of 613 learners, neo-literates, volunteer teachers as well as officials from 30 States /UTs participated in the ULLAS regional conference. Ladakh (already achieved 100

per cent literacy), Andaman & Nicobar Island, Bihar, Goa, Gujarat and Uttar Pradesh could not participate in any of the ULLAS regional conferences.

**Outcome of the Conferences:**

- Various perspectives and practices by the States /UTs from non-literate learners, neo-literates and volunteer teachers related to ULLAS implementation were explored.
- Created a synergy with the institutions working for the implementation of the scheme.
- Strategic planning to initiate required measures for strengthening implementation of ULLAS.
- The relevance of best practices was identified, appreciated and shared in digital platform/social media to inspire, motivate and replicate wherever possible.

## **A brief report on the ULLAS Regional Conferences**

### **Regional Conference I**

**In collaboration with: SCERT Haryana**

**Venue: SCERT Haryana, Gurgaon**

**Date: August 1- 2, 2024**

The first regional conference was organised in collaboration with SCERT Haryana on 1st and 2nd August, 2024. In this conference, **8 States and UTs namely Delhi, Haryana, Chandigarh, Punjab, Rajasthan, Uttarakhand, Himachal Pradesh and Jammu and Kashmir** participated. Fourteen participants including non-literate learners 6, neo-literates 2, volunteer teachers 2 and 2 officials each from SCERT and SLMA from each State/UTs were invited to participate in the conference. It was mandatory for all the participants of the State/UTs to register in the prescribed format. A total of **143 participants** registered and actively participated in the first regional conference. ( -II). Two-day sessions and activities were scheduled during the conference to achieve the desired objectives ( – I).

Lighting of the lamp with the vedic chanting by the Government School Students of Haryana, created an ambience of peace, purity, learning and sharing. The Chief Guest and invited dignitaries were honoured and welcomed by the SCERT – Haryana and participating States/UTs.

#### **Day 1 :**

##### **Inaugural Session:**

First session of the conference commenced with a warm welcome by Prof. Usha Sharma, In-charge CNCL. Dr. Sunil Bajaj formally welcomed the Chief Guests, Mrs. Archana Sharma Awasthi, Joint Secretary of the Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Education, Government of India, and Prof. Shridhar Srivastava, Joint Director -NCERT.

Prof. Srivastava, addressed the gathering by the ULLAS initiatives in the light of National Education Policy 2020. Mrs. Archana Sharma Awasthi, through her speech motivated learners, volunteer teachers, and neo-literates. The inaugural ceremony was further enlivened by a vibrant cultural program presented by school students, who also took an oath to become volunteer teachers. The session concluded with an expression of gratitude from Shri Pradeep B. Hedao, Under Secretary, Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Education, Government of India. Dr. Bani Bora, Senior Consultant, CNCL anchored the inaugural session.

Following the inaugural session, Dr. Kuldeep Kumar, Senior Consultant, Adult Education Bureau, MoE, Government of India, and Shri Rohit Nainwal, Consultant, CNCL, NCERT, on the successful implementation of the ULLAS program.

**Panel discussion:**

Onset of the session begins with the sharing of experiences and the challenges faced by the learners, volunteer teachers, and neo-literates from various states and union territories while implementing ULLAS. Strategies adapted to overcome the obstacles were also presented and discussed in length. The sessions were moderated by Ms. Suneeta Chauhan, Senior Consultant, AEB, MoE and Mr. Rohit Nainwal, Consultant, CNCL-NCERT.

**Day 2**

The second day of the conference was embarked with two sessions on panel discussion where Directors of SCERTs and SLMAs of the participating States and Union Territories exchanged insights on the best practices under the ULLAS initiative in their respective regions. They also shared the challenges they encountered during the implementation and the measures adapted to overcome the challenges. Dr. Bani Bora, Dr. Kuldeep Kumar, Ms. Sunita Chauhan and Mr. Rohit Nainwal moderated the discussions.

Panel discussions were followed by practical sessions on creating learner centric teaching-learning materials. Volunteer teachers, neo-literates and learners made groups to develop these materials from easily accessible resources, which could significantly enhance learning of foundational literacy and numeracy skills. These sessions were moderated by Ms. Yachna Gupta, Ms. Sunita Chauhan, Ms. Neha Kumar.

**Vote of thanks:**

All the seven participating States and Jammu and Kashmir, whose learners and VTs joined online, presented the learning-teaching materials developed in prior sessions. Mrs. Archana Sharma Awasthi, who joined online on 2<sup>nd</sup> day, commended the participants for their efforts, while appreciating the participants' enthusiasm and conveyed that the Honourable Education Minister, Mr. Dharmendra Pradhan's desire to showcase ULLAS at the upcoming G-20 summit in Brazil. She suggested to create a compendium to document the achievements of the ULLAS program, Prof. Usha Sharma, embracing these suggestions, thanked and congratulated everyone for the inclusion of ULLAS in the G-20 summit.

The conference concluded with Dr. Sunil Bajaj and Prof. Usha Sharma honouring the learners, volunteer teachers, and neo-literates with certificates and mementos.

## **Regional Conference II**

**In collaboration with : SLMA Bhopal**

**Venue: NITTTR, Bhopal**

**Date: September 12-13, 2024**

The second regional conference was organised in collaboration with SLMA Madhya Pradesh on **12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> September, 2024**. In this conference, Chhattisgarh and Maharashtra joined the participants from Madhya Pradesh and Dadra Nagar Haveli and Daman Diu joined online. A total of **126 participants** participated in the conference, which included Capacity Building of State Resource Group members of Madhya Pradesh (-II). Two-day sessions and activities were scheduled during the conference to achieve the desired objectives ( – I).

Lighting of the lamp with the Vedic chanting created an ambience of peace, purity, learning and sharing. The Chief Guest and invited dignitaries were honoured and welcomed by the SLMA Madhya Pradesh.

### **Day 1**

#### **Inaugural session:**

The Inaugural session of the conference began with the lamp lighting and Vedic Chanting by students. Prof .Usha Sharma In-charge, CNCL, NCERT gave the welcome address and thankful to Rajya Shiksha Kendra for collaborating with CNCL ,NCERT in organizing the second Regional Conference .

The importance of literacy, its various aspects and valuable perspectives of vocational education and training were the pivotal points of discussion by Guest of Honour Prof. Jaydip Mandal, Principal, RIE, Bhopal , Dr. Deepak Paliwal, Joint Director, PASSCIVE, Bhopal and Sh. Harjinder Singh, Secretary SLMA & Director RSK, Bhopal, M.P.



Sh. Sanjay Kr. Shukla Principal Secretary, Education M.P. delivered the Special Address and highlighted the importance of ULLAS, role of the State officials in the implementation of ULLAS in the State.

Mrs . Archana Sharma Awasthi, Joint Secretary of the Department of School Education and Literacy, Ministry of Education, Government of India , key note speaker of the conference emphasised that an effective literacy programs must be tailored to the specific needs and preferences of the learners. Mrs. Awasthi further stated that to truly empower learners and build a sustainable future, we must first understand what learners want to know and how do the learners wish to learn. The address set a clear direction for future educational strategies and Mrs.Awasthi's insight into learner-centric approaches were expected to drive significant improvements in literacy outcomes across the participating States.

The inaugural session was concluded with a vote of thanks by Dr. Rakesh Dubey from SCERT, SLMA and moderated by Sh. Siddhant Singh, Consultant – CNCL, NCERT.

### **Plenary Session:**

The first plenary session was on “Implementation of ULLAS” by CNCL, NCERT/AEB, Ministry of Education, Govt.of India. The speakers for the session were Prof. Usha Sharma, In-Charge, CNCL, Sh. Harjinder Singh, Secretary SLMA & Director RSK, Bhopal, M.P. The session was chaired by Mrs. Archana Sharma Awasthi.

The second plenary session was on experience sharing by learners, volunteer teachers, and neo-literates. Participants from Chhattisgarh and Madhya Pradesh shared their experiences and the challenges they faced and the strategies they employed to overcome these obstacles. This session was moderated by Dr.Bani Bora

The third plenary session was related with the sharing of Daman & Diu volunteer teachers' experiences, the strategies they employed and challenges they faced while imparting literacy amongst the non-literates. The session was conducted through online mode and was moderated by Ms. Sunita Chauhan, Senior Consultant, Adult Education Bureau, MoE. The presentation highlighted its commitment towards achieving full literacy in the Union Territory very soon. This ambitious goal was met with applause from all the participants of RC II.

Activities for Day 1, concluded with the cultural programmes presented by the local artists of Madhya Pradesh and Chhattisgarh.

### **Day 2**

The second day of the conference was embarked with a panel discussion where Directors of SCERTs and SLMAs from across the States and Union Territories exchanged insights on the best practices under the ULLAS initiative in their respective regions. They also shared the challenges they encountered during this mass movement and the solutions they devised. The session was moderated by Dr.Bani Bora and Ms.Suneeta Chauhan.

The panel discussion was followed by the preparation of learner centric teaching-learning materials by volunteer teachers, neo-literates and learners from easily accessible resources, which can significantly enhance their basic literacy and numeracy skills.

**Vote of thanks:**

The conference concluded with a certificate distribution ceremony, where participants who completed the training were recognized for their efforts. Prof. Usha Sharma, In-Charge of the Cell for National Centre for Literacy (NCERT), delivered the vote of thanks, expressing gratitude to the organising team of SLMA Madhya Pradesh for successful management of the conference. Prof. Sharma specially thanked the learners, neo-literates and volunteer teachers, as well as the officials of the States/UTs for their presence in the conference and contributing towards the fruitful completion of the conference.

## ULLAS- Nav Bharat Saaksharta Karyakram

### 3<sup>rd</sup> Regional Conference, 2024

#### Cell for National Centre for Literary- NCERT

**Venue:** Assam Administrative Staff College, Guwahati, Assam

**Date:** 22<sup>nd</sup>-23<sup>rd</sup> October, 2024

The third Regional Conference was conducted in Guwahati, Assam on 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> October, 2024 in collaboration with SLMA Assam. The conference was attended by ten participatory states (**Assam, Arunachal, Jharkhand, Manipur, Meghalaya, Mizoram, Nagaland, Sikkim, Tripura and West Bengal**). A total of **200 participants registered** and actively participated in the conference ( -II). Two-day sessions and activities were scheduled during the conference to achieve the desired objectives ( – VI).

Lighting of the lamp with the Vedic chanting created an ambience of peace, purity, learning and sharing. The Chief Guest and invited dignitaries were honoured and welcomed by the SLMA Assam.



#### Day 1

The Day 1 of the ULLAS 3<sup>rd</sup> Regional Conference was held in Guwahati, Assam and was commemorated by state official authorities from the Ministry, DIET officers, senior academicians, lecturers, ULLAS learners and volunteers. The Inaugural Session was convened by **Dr. Bani Bora**, Senior Consultant, CNCL, NCERT who introduced the ULLAS scheme- its motives and agenda set for the two-day Regional Conference. She also introduced and felicitated the dignitaries and guests of Day 1 of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Regional Conference.

Following this, the Welcome Address was given by **Shah Nawaz Chowdhury**, IAS, Secretary to the Govt. of Assam, Department of School Education and Nodal Officer, ULLAS. In his

speech, he mentioned how ULLAS aimed to create literate citizens who could become “resources of the country” that can be serviceable for the future growth of the country. He also emphasized how deliberations and interactive discussions among learners and volunteers from the ten participatory states of the conference could help ULLAS to attain its aims, objectives and success within a short period.

His speech was followed by the Special Address given by **Dr. Flourette G. Dkhar**, Principal, North East Regional Institute of Education, Meghalaya. In her address, Dr. Dkhar stated education as a “powerful weapon that you can be used to change the world”. She further mentioned that through ULLAS, the policy of NEP, 2020 has been justified and now lifelong education shall be possible. On this note, she urged all the constituents of NCERT and SCERT to help in enhancing and fulfilling learners’ abilities, aptitudes, desires, aims, aspirations and hope. In her concluding remarks, she suggested to the team of ULLAS to hold conferences, workshops, programs and orientation in the future to equip its participants with critical thinking, creativity, collaboration, communication skills and humane touch that should foster right values, ethics, attitudes and mental health. Through this, Dr. Dhkar urged for the enhancement of cognitive and emotional skills among citizens to make ULLAS a successful project.

The Key Note Address of the program was delivered by **Ms. Archana Sharma Awasthi**, Joint Secretary, Department of School Education and Literary, MoE. Ms. Awasthi provided the vision, aim and the future of ULLAS where she highlighted the learners and volunteers as the main players of the scheme. She mentioned ULLAS as a hybrid and multilingual project that has been operating on the system of volunteerism. She introduced the participants with the format, ideals, aims, objectives and previous activities of ULLAS. She also informed that there will a total of four regional conferences and how all of them shall focus on ways and methods to enhance teaching and learning materials for the uneducated. Ms. Awasthi also highlighted a probable success method to achieve the mission of ULLAS- a motivational system of credits among formal learners who could acquire extra marks if they engaged in educating the uneducated people by enrolling and fulfilling their duties as volunteer teachers of the ULLAS Program. She further mentioned the mode of assessment of the scheme is done through a well-structured examination “Foundation Literary and Numeracy Assessment Test” (FLNAT). In her extensive address, Ms. Awasthi mentioned the result of the recent Periodic Labour Force Survey (PLFS) of 2023-2024 where the average literary rate of India was concluded at 81%. Referring to the survey, she also noted that the literary rate of the North East India is above the country’s literary rate (Assam-87%, Arunachal Pradesh- 84.2%, Jharkhand-76.7%, Manipur-92%, Meghalaya-94.2%, Mizoram-98.2%, Nagaland-95.7%, Sikkim-84.7%, Tripura-93.7% and West Bengal-82%). Further, Ms. Awasthi stated that Ladakh has become the first fully literate state with 100% in the country.



Following her speech, **Dr. Ranoj Pegu**, Hon'ble Minister of Education, Assam delivered his speech that focused on the importance of basic reading and writing skills that could help in the enhancement of citizens in their social and leadership skills. He also referred to ULLAS as a “human responsibility” to their fellow members. He urged to not consider ULLAS as a mere government scheme/direction/notice/circular. Dr. Pegu stressed on the idea of “students as teachers” model for the success of ULLAS, which according to the speaker still needs more leadership and innovative ideas. Dr. Pegu mentioned that Assam still consists of many critical areas of low literary with special reference made of the tea tribal regions where ULLAS intervention could positively change the existing low literary rate in those areas. Dr. Pegu also encouraged in generating and maintaining a system where students could be motivated to be volunteer teachers for the uneducated in exchange of academic credit.

The exhilarating speech of Dr. Pegu was followed by the Vote of Thanks by **Prof. Usha Sharma** who expressed her gratitude to the Ministry of Education, official delegates, members of NCERT, SCERT, SLMA and all the ten participatory states- their VTs, learners, neo-literates and nodal officers. She ended her speech by urging everyone to remove all forms of segregation and dichotomy in education for she believes that individuals will make active efforts to improve the literary rate of the country and thereby accomplish the mission of ULLAS.

The inaugural session was followed by a presentation about the scheme ULLAS by **Dr. Kuldeep Kumar** and **Mr. Rohit Nainwal**. Dr. Kumar at the beginning of their presentation highlighted the aim of ULLAS which was to mobilize the uneducated into mainstream society by providing basic reading, writing, literary, numeracy, digital and financial learning. He commented that this attempt would empower them to contribute more for the growth of the country. He further provided details on how the scheme worked as a hybrid mode that provided certification after assessing the learners in their performance of the FLNAT examination. He concluded by remarking that this program is not a mere government scheme but a Jan Andolan that allows to re-design new teaching methods. The second part of the session was presented by Mr. Nainwal who provided figures of 15.7 million benefitted learners and the involvement of 3.7 million volunteer teachers. In addition, he also mentioned that the primers made by

ULLAS are available in 23 languages. In providing more details, he discussed how ULLAS works as a hybrid scheme with integrated classrooms based on volunteerism and the functioning of the ULLAS online App. that requires self-registration of the participant to get eligible to appear for the FLNAT examination which is conducted twice a year.

#### **Panel discussion:**

Panel discussions with the learners, volunteer teachers and neo-literates of the ten participatory states to share their field experiences were convened by **Ms. Jyoti Tiwari**, Consultant, CNCL, NCERT. The learners from the chosen states acknowledged that volunteer teachers played a significant role in generating awareness about ULLAS. They said that learning alphabets and numbers had instilled confidence into them and magnified their self-esteem, thereby making them self-dependent. The volunteer teacher from Jharkhand provided an exceptional example— he described how literacy had enabled female learners who were daily wage labourers to voice against the non-payment of their wages.

Panel discussions were followed by the **Cultural Evening** that was anchored by **Dr. Saurabi Borthakur**, Assistant Professor, Department of Commerce, Cotton University. The cultural evening was organised in the open space at the campus of Assam Administrative Staff College. The cultural evening offered a wide range of cultural performances showcasing the rich culture and tradition of North-East India. The Cultural Program was organized with the objective of understanding the rich culture and diversity of Assam. Bihu and Sattriya dancers enthralled the audience at the cultural program by sparking performances. Dancers from the Karbi and the Bodo communities delivered energy-packed traditional dance performances too. At the end of the program, a vote of thanks was proposed by the anchor whereby she thanked the organizing committee and all the performers for making the event possible.

#### **Day 2**

#### **Panel discussion:**

The second day of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Regional Conference began with the felicitation of the Directors of the ten participatory SCERTs and SLMAs were felicitated by Prof. Usha Sharma. The main agenda of this session was to discuss the best practices adopted by each of the participatory states. For this purpose, either the director of SCERT or the director of SLMA was called upon to speak about the best practices. The session was moderated by **Mr. Siddhant Singh**.

The session was followed by learner-centric group activity, facilitated by **Dr. Vibha Kaushik, Ms. Yachna Gupta, Mr. Aman Gupta**. The objective of the session was to make learners and volunteer teachers collectively create teaching-learning materials that must meet the learning outcomes as defined by the Cell for National Centre for Literacy. Six states, namely Assam, Tripura, Meghalaya, Jharkhand, Manipur, Meghalaya, and Sikkim participated in the activity. The learners and volunteer teachers from the states were provided stationary items on the spot and they were supposed to create Teaching-Learning materials by means of the items provided.

This was followed by the presentation of the teaching-learning materials of the six states. Each state was called upon one by one to demonstrate the teaching-learning material. Each state was given ten minutes to explain their learner-oriented teaching-learning material.

#### **Valedictory Session:**

Following the fun and innovative activities and the presentations, the **Valedictory Session** was conferred by Prof. Usha Sharma, Dr. Bani Bora and Dr. Nirada Devi. In this session, participants were felicitated and provided certification for their active participation in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Regional Conference of ULLAS. Additionally, members of all SCERTs, SLMAs, NCERT and the organizing team were felicitated and provided certification for their participation.

This ceremonial session was followed by the **Way Forward Session** that was delivered by Prof. Usha Sharma who thanked all the participants, delegates and dignitaries for making the Conference a success. The bonding of the participants was appreciated by the speaker while contributing to making the TLMs.

Dr. Nirada Devi, Director, SCERT, Assam and Chairman SCL, Assam delivered the **Vote of Thanks** where she thanked all the participants, guests, dignitaries and the organizing committee for their active involvement in the 3<sup>rd</sup> Regional Conference of ULLAS and making it a grand success. Dr. Devi ended her speech on a high note of motivation on how the conference had inspired everyone involved with ULLAS to make the future of India a Vikshit Bharat. Explaining herself, she noted that continuously working to achieve the vision of ULLAS could help us to become a self-sufficient nation.

**Date:** 17<sup>th</sup> – 18<sup>th</sup> February, 2025

The fourth regional conference was organised in collaboration with SLMA Telangana, Hyderabad on 17<sup>th</sup> -18<sup>th</sup> February,2025 at Dr. MCR HRD Institute, Hyderabad. Eight State/UTs, **Andhra Pradesh, Lakshadweep, Karnataka, Kerala, Odisha, Puducherry, Telangana and Tamil Nadu** registered for the conference and actively participated in the conference. There was a total of **144 participants** in the regional conference IV ( -VII). Two-day sessions and activities were scheduled during the conference to achieve the desired objectives ( – VIII).



Lighting of the lamp with the Vedic chanting by the volunteer teachers from Andhra Pradesh created an ambience of peace, purity, learning and sharing. The Chief Guest and invited dignitaries were honoured and welcomed by the SLMA Telangana and participating States/UTs.

**Inaugural session:**

Dr. Usha Rani, Adult Education Director welcomed the representatives of the nine states who came to participate in the event and were congratulated on behalf of the State Literacy Mission Authority. It was stated that organising the ULLAS regional conference in collaboration with the SLMA Telangana in Hyderabad was an encouraging experience. She said that the program would be discussed in the state, as well as the problems

faced by the program, so as to explore the best possibilities to transform non-literate population into literate ones in the State. Following the inaugural session, the Chief Guest, dignitaries and esteemed guests were felicitated by Prof.Usha Sharma.

Speaking on the occasion, SPD Sri E.V Narasimha Reddy said, "I am very happy to see all of you from different states. Special thanks to the Joint Secretary, Department of School Education and Literacy Ministry of Education for Conducting 4th National ULLAS Regional Conference in Telangana. The Government of India has made a fine action plan for complete literacy. Those who have been educated in every household through the Nav Bharat Saaksharta programme illiterate of them should be transformed to literate. He said that the each of 16 lakhs students who go to school, if they turned an non-literate to literate we can achieve absolute literacy. He said that there were a large number of women self -help groups in Telangana and Andhra Pradesh. Through them, we could educate the literates in the respective groups and turned them to literates. Mrs. Archana Sharma Awasthi, Joint Secretary, Department of School Education & Literacy, Ministry of Education, Govt of India, gave the **keynote address**. Speaking on the occasion, she congratulated SLMA Telangana for organising the fourth regional conference in Hyderabad, Telangana. Mrs. Awasthi stated that through regional conferences, direct interaction with the learners, neo literates and volunteer teachers became possible. ULLAS gave opportunities to the non-literate learners to become literate. Mrs. Awasthi stated that in this digital era, where everyone uses mobile phone in some way or other, critical skills like digital literacy, financial literacy could be used to help non-literate population of the State/UTs to become literate. Hence, helping a non-literate person to become literate would not be a difficult task.

Mrs. Archana Sharma Awasthi, Joint Secretary, congratulated 85 -year -old learner Kadiakutti Amma from Malappuram, Kerala and honoured her for becoming inspiration to others.

Prof.Usha Sharma, Incharge- CNCL, NCERT, New Delhi, concluded the inaugural session by thanking the Joint Secretary for designing such an inspiring and motivational conference under ULLAS. She congratulated every learners, neo literates, volunteers who came to this conference. It is said that in the implementation of ULLAS program everyone should work hard for absolute literacy. She congratulated the Telangana SLMA Team, which has given full support to the event, congratulated them for providing good programs and accommodation facilities.

Inaugural session was followed by a presentation on Implementation of ULLAS by Ms. Neha Kumar, Consultant, AEB, MoE. Ms. Neha explained the actions to be taken for implementation of ULLAS . She explained about volunteerism and community
